











THE TEMPLE WAS BUILT OF LIGHT GRAY LIMESTONE; IT WAS 128 FT. LONG, 88 FT. BROAD, 60 FT. HIGH AND TO THE TOP OF THE TOWER 200 FT. IT HAD 30 HEWN PILASTERS, WHICH COST \$3,000 EACH. THE WHOLE COST OF THE BUILDING WAS \$1.000,000. THE BAPTISMAL FOUNT, SUPPORTED ON 12 CARVED OXEN, WAS IN THE BASEMENT STORY, AND WITH THE OXEN WAS INTENDED TO BE GILDED. CORNER STONE LAID, APRIL 6, 1841. BURNED, OCTOBER 8-9, 1848. JOSEPH SMITH KILLED AT CARTHAGE, JUNE 27, 1844.























Construction of domed roof on Salt Lake Tabernacle. (DUP Photo Collection)













