

They are so appreciative of what our organization has accomplished, and they hope to do as well. It is their 60th anniversary since the Gospel had been taken to their country. This was a big day for them, and they chose to share it with us at our museum.

You will notice that we have double the Memorial list this time due to a mistake in the last issue. You will be pleased to know that we receive three times the number of applications for new memberships in the same amount of time so we are a growing organization.

To help you plan ahead for the summer: July 4th, of course, is a fun community celebration and the 24th of July will be on July 25th this year, which means that we will have two July 24ths and no 25th of July. Check and correct your calendar with that bit of confusing information. You do remember that we always have a large Open House here at the museum following The Days of '47 Parade. We usually entertain about 500 to 600 people with pioneer music, demonstrations, and refreshments. Refreshments will be "homemade" bread and butter (our guests help churn the butter). DAUGHTERS, GET YOUR 'SHERLOCK' ON!

Vandalism and theft of bronze plagues is occurring far too frequently. Many companies and camps have had to replace markers. ISDUP purchases the original marker. If your marker is stolen, your camp or company pays for the replacement. ISDUP can assist in ordering a replacement marker that thieves cannot sell for salvage.

The top priority right now is to check the marker's condition. Is the plaque missing? If the answer is yes, then report it to ISDUP. Is the plaque loose? Get it repaired! Is the mortar loose or missing? Please make the needed repairs. If a stone is missing replace it with stone of similar size and type. If those wicked weeds have infested the area, please remove them. Graffiti? Targeted by birds? Weathered or water stained? Arm yourselves with buckets of soap and hot water and use a little elbow grease. Let your daughters, children, grandchildren, or Scouts assist. Please beautify our markers and check on them often. In the spring, plant wildflowers, perennials, or annuals but only if there is a source of water. Maintaining ISDUP markers is a legitimate use of DUP funds. Any DUP markers in your area are your responsibility for maintenance. Thank you for your support in taking care of these lovely markers that commemorate our pioneer heritage.

Laura **Fawcett Jefferson** brought the most interesting artifact to DUP. She is a member of our Desert Rose Camp, Salt Lake North Company, Utah and grew up in DUP. Her mother friends lived in the Salt Lake Avenues. Many of their mothers were part of Camp 21 who faithfully attended daytime DUP camp meetings. Their daughters felt left out and determined to join together in the evening and have their husbands watch over their

children while they attended DUP, thus **Desert Rose Camp** was organized in 1973. As each daughter purchased a home to grow their young families in, they found themselves dispersed throughout the Intermountain area. They continue to take turns hosting camp meetings and socials in their homes and faithfully rotate board positions to share the load, perpetuate their camp, and the mission of DUP.

Laura joined DUP and began attending the Deseret Rose Camp 13 years ago when she was 21 years old. She's since married, taken her turn as camp vice and captain, served on the Salt Lake North Company board, and will deliver her third child next month.

Nurtured in DUP and by her mother's example, she was keenly aware of the value of an old discarded quilt found in 2012 in her husband's grandmother's attic in Monroe, Wisconsin. His grandmother La Vaun Smith Jefferson was born in Centerville, Utah. The guilt was soiled and had been chewed on by rodents, and no one in her husband's family wanted the thing. Laura did. It was given to her and thus began her research. She displayed it as an artifact at our company jubilee earlier this year. Last week, it was her turn to present a history at our camp meeting. Instead, she thrilled us with the story and research of her treasured quilt.
