

### WEST JORDAN PIONEER CHURCH MARKER #332

The marker on the building had been stolen so a new marker was rededicated and unveiled after a general meeting. ### EARLY EAST MILLCREEK SCHOOLS **MARKER #502**

The "Early East Millcreek Schools" Marker is once again a glittering tribute to our pioneer ancestors. Originally dedicated in October 1999, the monument — located on 2700 East near Evergreen Ave (3435 South) in Salt Lake City, Utah tells of the first school houses built in the Millcreek area.

Under the direction of the Salt Lake Canyon Trails **Company**, the granite marker was cleaned of 20 years of accumulated grime and tree sap in June 2015. Mike Wilmuenster cleaned and restored the marker to its original appearance. Overhanging tree branches were trimmed away, as well as pesky weeds removed from the base of the monument, making it more visible to passersby. Our pioneer ancestors would be pleased.
