

#### **LEGACY CELEBRATES 40 YEARS IN 2023**

The first issue of Legacy was published in 1983. In 2018, ISDUP officers met to decide how to celebrate the occasion. They determined that the cover page would be a picture of the original board members. In the story they listed Emma Olson as the first editor of the Legacy and also ISDUP President. They wanted to feature how the Legacy was produced. President Cheryl R. Searle worked with members, and editor, Verna Hazelbaker, to write articles about important events, the growth of the Museum, and what members could access for research. They asked members to have an event called "35 years of Legacy news and 35 years of honoring our pioneer heritage." For the first time the Legacy was posted online, and editions starting in 2014 are available. The Legacy has remained essentionally the same over the years, but stories and pictures from the members have increased greatly. Now that current issues are online, members have a choice to opt out of receiving it in the mail.

#### FIRST LIEUTENANT DAWN DIMICK USES DUP MUSEUM FOR RESEARCH

First Lieutenant **Dawn Dimick**, the first woman to study military chaplaincy in BYU's graduate program, did research in the ISDUP Museum Library. She enlisted in the military at the age of 17 and joined the Army ROTC to help pay her way through college. She graduated from Utah State University with a degree in Religious and International Studies. She served an LDS Mission to Russia. She is the first woman to graduate with a Master's Degree in military chaplaincy. The program had only been open to males. She worked as a chaplain at St. Mark's Hospital in Millcreek as part of a team along with doctors and nurses to care for patients and their families. Chaplains help care for people of all faiths. She learned about the role of chaplains in our DUP camps and companies — to help and support members while setting the spiritual tone for our meetings. #### ADELAIDE CAMP CELEBRATES ANNIVERSARY

The **Adelaide Camp**, Davis Heritage Company, Bountiful, Utah, recently celebrated its 69th anniversary.

Adelaide Camp was chartered on March 4, 1954, and named after the nearby Adelaide Elementary School. Adelaide Ridges Wood, known as "Aunt Addy" by those in her community, was a daughter of an early pioneer who brought one of the first organs to Utah. Adelaide married George Cotton Wood, founder of nearby Woods Cross, Utah. The Wood family later donated the land to build the elementary school, on the condition that it was named after Adelaide. The entrance to the elementary school has a plaque that reads: "Honor thy Father and Thy Mother" at the family's request.



The Adelaide Camp first met in members' homes, and later in the Serv Us Drug at 55 North Main Street in Bountiful. They currently meet at the Orchard Ward House of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, next door to the Adelaide School.

#### SAGWICH CAMP RECEIVES GRANT

The **Sagwich Camp**, Cache Far South Company, Paradise, Utah, received a project grant from the Utah Division of Arts and Museums. The grant was used for improvement

projects and materials to better preserve the collection housed in the Museum located in Paradise, Utah. The Museum is an old Tithing Office built in 1902. Part of the grant money was used to replace a worn out screen door with a new one that matches the historical period of the building. Display glass on a cases, display case, museum grade storage boxes were purchased.

During this Museum "revival" the camp was inspired to make a book con-

taining the stories and locations of original settlers and some of the early pioneers in Paradise, as well as Native American's stories. Materials were gleaned from numerous sources and pictures obtained to preserve the look and location of original homes before they were lost. With the completion of the book, we are no longer "Paradise Lost," but "Paradise Found." The book *Historical Paradise and Avon — two cultures looking for freedom and peace in the same Paradise*, is an ongoing research project, updated as new information comes forward. This project is led by Emily Williams.

#### **SWEETWATER CAMP MEETS AT NIGHT**

Our **Sweetwater Camp** has been meeting at night with great success for the past 17 years, but how did it all begin?

Both of my Grandmas, my Great Grandma, and my Mom were active in DUP for many years. My Mom was in a DUP camp that met at night for as long as I can remember, and since she enjoyed it so much, I guess you could say DUP has always been in my blood.

The first camp I joined in 1990 met during the day. I really enjoyed my time there, but after three years of living in Argentina and the need to work after returning home, the only way I could still be involved in DUP was to start an evening camp. So on September 12, 2006, a large group of 20 women gathered. Everyone was excited about the opportunity to be part of DUP. The history I shared that night was of my great grandmother, Mary Elizabeth Neslin Busby, who was born on the banks of the Sweetwater River, and was active in DUP as an Honorary Member since she was an actual Pioneer. Everyone's ancestors crossed the Sweetwater, and since that was the year we celebrated the 150th anniversary of the Sweetwater Rescue, we decided to name our new camp Sweetwater.

Since that night we have added many members, and after all these years our camp is still vibrant and active. For us a night camp was the perfect way to gather and enjoy the rich DUP tradition of histories, relics, the Pledge of Allegiance, and lessons, but most of all build special friendships that we all share. Night camps are great because they allow everyone a chance to participate. Whether our members are working or not during the day, our night camp makes it possible for everyone to participate. When we join together in DUP, we happily share time for learning and friendship. I am so proud to be a Daughter and to know that my family's four-generation DUP tradition still continues, but in addition that all the Daughters in our camp are also finding pride in their own pioneer ancestors.

#### YALECREST CAMP SILK PRESENTATION

DUP Marker #73, "Pioneer Silk Industry," was restored and rededicated in October 2021 under the direction of the **Yalecrest Camp**. Originally constructed in 1941, the monument is on the same ground where mulberry trees grew and the silkworm industry was begun under the leadership of Zina D. H. Young.

The Yalecrest Camp's interest in the pioneer silk industry continues, and Sasha Coles, a history professor at Penn State University, gave a special presentation at their camp meeting in December 2022. She reminded us that to spur growth, Zina Young travelled throughout the territory instructing Sisters how to cultivate mulberry trees, raise the worms, and spin the silk. The Utah Legislature voted to pay a bounty of 25 cents for every pound of silkworm cocoons raised. The industry was not successful because mulberry trees were not well suited to Utah weather and the production of the silk from the worms was extremely difficult. Sasha shared some funny stories about her own efforts to raise cocoons and produce the thread. According to Sasha, "those who worked in the silkworm industry exhibited strong industriousness, self-sufficiency, and independence."


